Lesson/Workshop 2 "Debate for all"

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Aims of the lesson

In this activity participants will be invited to reflect and debate around a topic of common and general interest, such as energy, climate or health, supporting two opposite positions.



Description


Concrete steps:

- Introduction: the trainer introduces the workshop and its learning objectives (5')
- Teams setting and instructions delivery: participants are split into two groups and each of them will be assigned a position which is opposite to the others' team (for example: the left and right parties in the EU Parliament) (10')
- The trainer launches some driving question related to a topic of common and contemporary interest, such as energy, climate or health, like: should we pay increase or decrease taxation?, should we allow LGBTQ+ families?, etc (5')
- The workshop will be realised following this sequence of steps:
- Teams discussion (20')
- Thesis presentation (10')
- Contrathesis creation in each team (20')
- Contra thesis presentation (10')
- Teams discussion (20')
- Synthesis presentation (10')
- Final open discussion and debriefing (10')

Learning objectives

- Increasing the specific knowledge on a topic of common and general interest
- Increasing the debate-related skills
- Fostering the following key competences, among others:
 - Multilingual
 - Mathematical, science, technology and engineering
 - Citizenship
 - Entrepreneurship
 - Personal, social and learning to learn
